ARIZONA CHAPTER HOSTS FIRST SIG TAU GAMES

The newly established Zeta Pi Associate Chapter at the University of Arizona went for gold in their first ever philanthropy event this past May. Only weeks before, several brothers were given the unique opportunity to volunteer at the Coronado Area Track and Field Competition held by the Special Olympics.





Inspired by the competition, Sig Tau organized the Sig Tau Games to support Special Olympics in the Tucson area.

On May 30, nearly 100 students arrived at University of Arizona's William Sutton Field to participate in the games. Team competitions included inflatable obstacle courses, inflatable joust arenas, tug of war, and other team relay activities. Competitive spirits came out, fighting for the top prizes. After the games, one male and one female team took home first place and cash prizes.

"Being the first philanthropy event put on by our chapter, the Sig Tau Games event was a great success in many aspects," said Vice President of Programs, Nick Quon. "We were able to promote Sig Tau at Arizona, and raise funds and awareness for Special Olympics here in the Tucson community."

From the event, Sig Tau raised over \$500 benefitting the Special Olympics. The money raised will go towards the Coronado Area Special Olympics.
