NATIONAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAMMING

National leadership programming provides the opportunity for brothers from across the country to gain wisdom through unique experiences, challenges them to find their purpose through a values-based curriculum, and teaches them to lead a life of nobility. Investing in these programs provides a measurable impact on the collegiate and lifelong membership experience and challenges us to live courageously and nobly lead others.

EARL A. WEBB ACADEMY FOR PRINCIPLED LEADERS

Sigma Tau Gamma was the first national fraternity to hold a President's conference, then known as Chapter President's Boot Camp. Since the first boot camp in 1985, now known as the Earl A. Webb Academy for Principled Leaders, the leadership program has evolved and now includes four chapter officers, plus an alumni advisor track; the purpose has remained the same: to provide time and space for brothers to become effective leaders for their chapters, develop personal and officer goals, and to design a framework for chapter success. This three-day program of intense leadership training and networking with other undergraduate officers, university professionals, Fraternity volunteers, and Headquarters Staff concentrates on personal and chapter leadership.

NOBLE MAN INSTITUTE

Noble Man Institute is designed specifically for the newest members of Sig Tau – the future leaders of our chapters and campuses. Since its inception in 2016, the retreat-based, substance-free format lends itself to a program that is hosted in a camp setting, utilizes large and small group curriculum presentation, peer led facilitation, ropes challenge courses, family-style meals, an evening campfire and alumni panel.

After this experience, the new members should return to campus with a better understanding of their leadership style, and a stronger and deeper connection to the fraternity. Attendees develop a vision for themselves and their fraternity and will use that vision, along with their newly honed leadership skills, to help move their chapter forward and make a difference on their campus and community. The program's curriculum utilizes large group sessions to introduce ideas and then smaller group discussions to dive deeper into the topic.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Following Noble Man Institute, attendees will be able to:

- Describe their personal values and the Principles of Sigma Tau Gamma.
- Explain the Five Practices of Exemplary Leadership and identify their highest practice.
- Compare and contrast the difference between fraternal ideals and behaviors.
- Articulate ways to make a difference in their chapter and community.
- ▼ Identify key constituents and strategies to build collaborative relationships with these groups.
- Describe resiliency and employ strategies to bounce back from failure.
- Recognize the importance that fraternity membership plays on personal development and lifelong success.
- Create a vision for themselves and their chapter.

YOUR IMPACT ON FUTURE BROTHERS

Developing and maintaining a long-term partnership with PhiredUp and TechniPhi will enable Sig Tau to recruit and train future leaders.

- \$200,000 Fully funded partnership for (5) years
- \$29,050 Fully fund ChapterBuilder for all Sig Tau chapters for (1) year
- \$9,900 Fully fund staff/chapter training and coaching calls for (1) year

A \$200,000 investment would provide funding to ensure the relationship with Phired Up Productions for the next five years and create a positive recruitment culture through 2025.

COACHING AND EDUCATION
