TALES FROM TOWSON



Boots are on the ground for Sigma Tau Gamma's first expansion in nearly two years. Recruitment & Growth Coordinator Zack Kearney, UNC Charlotte, arrived on campus at the end of August and holds interest meetings, connects with campus administrators, and uses his training to secure signed bids. Zack is noticing trends on campus at Towson and in talking with chapters about recruitment across the country.

Q: What are your thoughts about the campus experience at Towson so far?

A: I've been on campus for almost a month now and Towson is such a diverse campus. It is exciting for Sig Tau to have a presence here. You can tell people around campus are happy to have a new fraternity. Towson is culturally rich, with people from literally all over the world coming from all walks of life. I think the men I'm recruiting here will all bring a unique perspective to the new chapter.

Q: How did the first chapter meeting go?

A: We had our first chapter meeting recently, I had a full agenda I wanted to get through to continue to set these guys up for success, but we barely made it through half because all the guys wanted to make deeper connections with one another. You can tell they care and want to create connections that will last a lifetime. It is super encouraging to see that from day one.







Q: As you have connected with guys on campus and spoken with directors of recruitment across the country, what stands out to you most about this fall?

A: Well, you can tell students were ready to get back to campus and recruitment numbers are reflecting that. Some of these students have had a crazy college experience so far, with some not stepping foot on campus since March 2020. That is almost three full semesters of Zoom learning and having to adapt because of Covid. You can tell our men are thankful to be able to walk on campus. Throwing a football or frisbee on the quad, eating together in dining halls, and just sitting next to folks in class, students needed this.

Q: What can you tell us about some of the Towson Founding Fathers so far?

A: While the class is still growing as guys continue to sign bids, this group will band together to be a force on campus. They all want to see Greek life done the right way and create a different experience than what some other fraternities are offering. Most of them actually never saw themselves as Greek men, but the ability to create a thriving organization and connect to students across campus is why they joined. I've even had one founding father join me for sorority presentations, and to see him gain confidence from standing in front of an entire room of sorority women and explain why Sig Tau will make a difference on campus is amazing to watch.

Q: Any final thoughts?

A: I think this semester is shaping up to be one for the ages for recruitment. I've spoken with several chapters across the country that are blowing it out of the water. Larger chapters are growing, and even some of our smaller chapters are doubling in size. Good things will come when you pair good recruitment practices with genuine guys who want the most out of their campus experience.
