# **GAMMA PHI CHAPTER HOMECOMING EXCELLENCE**



Most homecoming celebrations, if you are familiar with the tradition, typically happen during the fall semester. It is centered around a football game or a fall sports outing. For the University of Southern Indiana, homecoming actually happens during the spring semester. Basketball is a big part of the campus culture at Southern Indiana, and the Gamma Phi Chapter showed no doubt in their school pride this homecoming.

Homecoming week was fueled by games, karaoke nights, a pizza design contest at a local pizzeria, and ends with a lipsync battle and the crowning of homecoming court. For the first time in six years, Sig Tau had a brother represented on homecoming court. Former chapter president Hairo Rivas, Southern Indiana, was one of only 12 students nominated to serve on homecoming court. At Southern Indiana, the faculty and staff actually nominate candidates for homecoming court, identifying students that exhibit traits of being a leader inside and outside of the classroom.

"Sig Tau gave me the confidence to become more of a leader on campus and to make an impact," Rivas said. "I would not be where I am today without my brothers. No matter where you go on campus, you can see guys wearing the letters and being positive role models. When you keep your head on

straight and do fraternity the right way, you can accomplish anything."

The Gamma Phi Chapter also raised the most money leading up to the lipsync battle at the end of the week. Teams from across campus practice hours to perfect their routine and perform it on the hardwood in front of a bleacher filled audience. Tickets are sold for the event, with all proceeds going to local philanthropies. Rivas said it was a complete chapter effort to become more involved in homecoming this year.

"Everyone was on board and knew homecoming would be a good way to represent Sig Tau. Having a group of guys be present for almost every event shows that we care about our university and helps break the fraternity stereotype."
