DEFINITIONS

- According to Psychology Today, the bystander effect occurs when the presence of others discourages an individual from intervening in an emergency situation, against a bully, or during an assault or other crime.
- The opposite of being a bystander, is being an upstander. According to *The Bully Project*, an upstander is someone who recognizes when something is wrong and acts to make it right.
- Let's practice this concept for a moment.



WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

 If a fellow student were livestreaming a fight in which several students were attacking another, and you saw that 100 people were watching the video, what would you do?



THE 5Ds TO INTERVENE

- Distract pretending to know the person being harassed, dropping a drink near the harasser, etc.
- Delegate asking a nearby authority figure for help.
- Delay checking in with the harassed person afterward.
- Direct verbally confronting the harasser.
- Document recording video of the incident.
