# MEMBER EDUCATION

The Path of Principles Member Education Program is transitioning to become a three-phase program – Sigma Phase, Tau Phase, and Gamma Phase – creating educational opportunities for brothers from first-year students to seniors.

Continued elevation of member education is paramount for Sigma Tau Gamma. The new Path of Principles Member Education Program aims to create a more holistic approach for today's undergraduate brothers.

Society of the Seventeen Inductee and Foundation Board of Trustee member D.W. Cole, Truman State, served on the current member education committee and was Sigma Tau Gamma's National President when the original Path of Principles Program was launched.

"Reviewing the member education process is something the organization has needed and one that will create better and stronger chapters," Cole said. "We are aiming to include more history of the organization, have sent surveys to brothers gauging what current undergraduate students need, and are working with trusted partners in higher education. Our Centennial year provided the perfect timing to focus on the future noble men of Sig Tau."

The re-envisioned member education program is multi-faceted and focuses on education throughout the entire undergraduate experience, not just as a new member. A member education committee began work on the creation of the program in 2020, having a phased rollout beginning with the Sigma Phase in 2021, followed by the Tau Phase, and finally the Gamma Phase.

## NOBLE KNIGHT CHAPTER CHALLENGE

Spring 2021, the Foundation launched the first Noble Knight Chapter Challenge in an effort to raise support for Chapter Funds. This tournament-style giving challenge involved brotherly competition and head-to-head matchups between our active chapters separated into three divisions.

After four rounds of competition, the campaign raised \$16,403 for 44 chapters, including the creation of nine new Chapter Funds.

# FOUNDATION FIRSTS

## EMERGENCY RELIEF GRANTS

Fall 2020, the Sigma Tau Gamma Foundation recognized an immediate need among our members as they began their return to campus. For the first time, the Foundation would offer Emergency Relief Grants to undergraduate members. This was an opportunity to support members through a difficult period of financial uncertainty and help offset the costs of tuition, educational supplies, and living expenses. \$13,000 was awarded in total, between 52 grants to brothers in need across the country.

## ADDED SCHOLARSHIPS FOR PRINCIPLE AWARDS

The Principle Awards (Learning, Integrity, Excellence, Leadership, Citizenship, Brotherhood) were introduced in 2017 and are awarded to brothers who exemplify the qualities of the specific Principle in their everyday life. Due to the success of this past #GivingTuesday, in 2021, each recipient also received a \$500 scholarship. Over \$10,000 is connected to national awards and scholarships given to undergraduates each year.

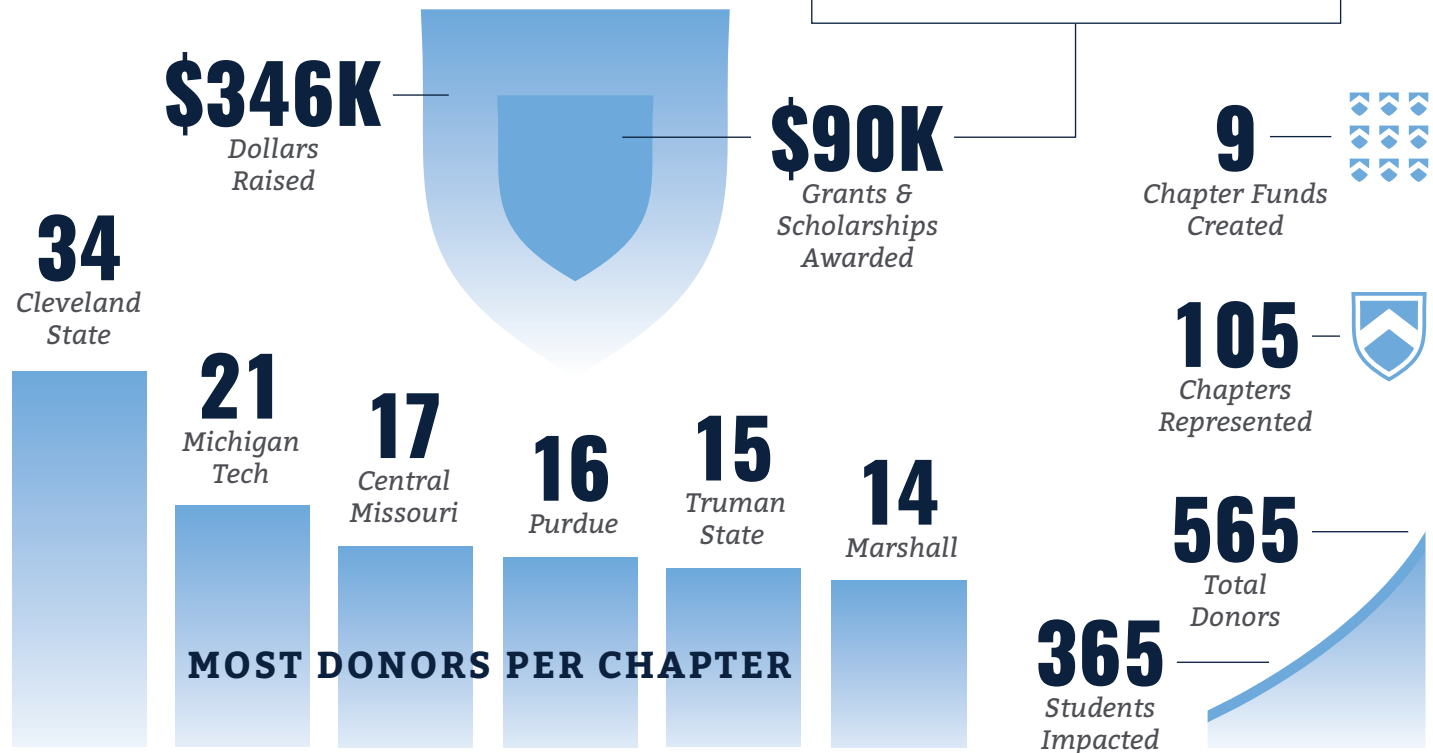
