BROTHERS FROM BOULDER RAISE OVER \$7,000 FOR SPECIAL OLYMPICS

The Zeta Psi Chapter at the University of Colorado Boulder prides itself on being able to give back to Special Olympics each year. Their 4th annual Polar Plunge took place on April 9 at the Boulder Reservoir, where they were able to raise money and awareness for Special Olympics.



While most of the brothers posted their fundraising links on their social media pages, asking friends, family, and others to donate to a worthy cause, other brothers went door to door in their neighborhoods to generate awareness and momentum.

“It was fun to have that competition element,” said Zeta Psi Chapter President James Faudel, Colorado.

“We split our guys into two groups to see which team could raise the most money, and we were really impressed with how much of an impact we were able to make.”

The only goal that the chapter set for itself was to increase the impact they made from the previous year of \$6,900. The chapter raised \$7,201 in total for Special Olympics between the two teams.

“For the future, we’re planning to keep doing Polar Plunge each spring because it’s a big part of what it means to be a Sig Tau at Boulder, but ultimately we’d just like to continue fighting the good fight for Special Olympics as best as we can.”

This month, we feature the Mu Chapter at the University of Southeastern Oklahoma. The Mu Chapter at Southeastern Oklahoma State University in Durant, Oklahoma, was the 12th chartered chapter in Sigma Tau Gamma, chartering on January 12, 1929. Since its inception, over 1,300 men have been initiated into the Mu Chapter, including the 17th National President and Society of the Seventeen Inductee Pat Phelps.
