Leading up to the event, members reached out to businesses for donations, raising nearly \$500. An additional \$305 was collected through a fundraiser, bringing their total to \$705. Inspired by a moving speech from a Special Olympics athlete at Grand Conclave, the chapter was eager to make an impact. "Hearing firsthand from an athlete about how Special Olympics changed their life really put everything into perspective for us."

The Polar Plunge is more than a fundraiser—it strengthens the fraternity's bond and reputation on campus. "Each fundraiser teaches responsibility and builds brotherhood." Faculty and staff even anticipate the event, often reaching out for updates.
