# Start Planning Early: Build Structure and Standards

**Key Tip:** Begin planning months in advance. Identify your chapter's core values, build a recruitment team, and set clear standards for membership.

"The first thing I knew I wanted to do after building my recruitment team was figuring out, 'What are we going to be known for?' Once we built that, selling ourselves to PNMs becomes so much

Derrick emphasized the importance of planning recruitment early, setting standards, and ensuring every brother is on the same page before recruitment.

# Use the Summer to Stay Visible and Build Connections

**Key Tip:** Recruitment doesn't start when school begins, it starts during the summer. Chapters should be highly active on social media and at summer orientations.

## Nathan Pfau, UW-Whitewater:

"We go to Instagram pages for incoming freshmen, DM them, and invite them to events."

"We're one of the only fraternities tabling at every freshman orientation. It's about being the face they see first."

# **Actionable Ideas**

- Post weekly on Instagram (ex: "Brother of the Week," rush teasers).
- DM incoming freshmen personally, not just mass messages.
- Share stories that highlight brotherhood, personal growth, and philanthropy.

# **WPN MOVE-OUT: QUICK TIPS & IMPORTANT INFO**



As the end of the semester approaches, it's time to start preparing for moving out. Whether you're leaving for good or just heading out for the summer, it's important to follow the proper steps to ensure a smooth transition. Below are some quick tips and key reminders to help you wrap things up responsibly and avoid any lastminute issues.

# 1. Schedule Your Move-Out

If you're not returning next year and are vacating your room, please coordinate your move-out date with your house manager. This ensures the proper check-out process is followed.

# 2. Complete the Check-Out Form & Take Photos

Before leaving, fill out the check-out form completely and sign it. Take clear photos of your room after it's emptied to document its condition. These will be compared to your move-in form and photos to determine the responsibility for any damage found. Turn in both the form and photos to your house manager.

# 3. Room Condition

Your room should be broom-clean with all trash removed before you leave.

# 4. Return Your Key

If your room has a key, it must be returned to your house manager according to their move-out process and properly documented.

# 5. Update Your Mailing Address

Make sure we have your correct mailing address on file. If your security deposit is eligible for return, it will be sent there. Incorrect or missing addresses can delay the return process.

# 6. If You're Returning Next Year

Even if you're staying in the house next year, please ensure your room is clean, trash-free, and your belongings are secure before leaving for the summer.

## 7. 12-Month Lease Reminders

If you're in a house with a 12-month lease and staying over the summer, be aware that summer maintenance and projects will be happening. Please coordinate with your house manager, CSL, or any contractors as access to parts of the house may be needed.
