

The Phi Chapter is moving forward with one of the most exciting projects in its chapter history: the construction of a brand-new chapter house. The 5,000-square-foot home will feature seven bedrooms, house eleven brothers, and will serve as a space for brotherhood, leadership, and lifelong memories.



The goal is to raise \$350,000 by December 2025 to break ground in 2026. Alumni from multiple generations have stepped forward, offering not only financial support but also professional expertise in architecture, real estate, and project management to bring this vision to life.

Alumnus Dwayne Judice described the meaning behind the effort:

"This project is about leaving a legacy. None of us have ever done anything like this before, but it's amazing to see brothers from every generation come together."

For the undergraduates, the project is just as exciting. Chapter President Lawson Hendry shared his perspective:

"When I first heard the house was finally going to happen, it was pure excitement—not just for me, but for the entire chapter. Alumni are flying in from across the country to support this project, and that shows the strength of our brotherhood."

The Phi Chapter House Project is more than a building, it's a testament to brotherhood across generations. With alumni and undergraduates united behind a shared vision, Phi Chapter continues to build a lasting legacy for future Noble Men. At Homecoming, October 17-18, undergraduate brothers and alumni will gather to celebrate, show support, and raise funds to bring the project closer to its goal. Sigma Tau Gamma is also providing opportunities for alumni to make tax-deductible contributions to the project through the Phi Library Fund.
